

# 2024 TOWN OF SHERWOOD, CLARK COUNTY, WISCONSIN

## APRIL TOWN BOARD MINUTES

April 13, 2024

---

The Town Board of Sherwood was called to order on Saturday April 13, 2024 at 9:10AM at the Sherwood Town Hall. Supervisor, Ken Schwanebeck, Supervisor, Rick Schwanebeck, Treasurer, Jessica Bucheger and Clerk, Margaret "Peggi" Schwanebeck were present. Resident Lowell Freedlund and Al Bucheger were present.

The notice was posted at the Sherwood Town Hall, the Pittsville Record, the Roadhouse Bar & Grill and at the Sherwood Electrical Substation.

Agenda as follows: call to order, pledge of allegiance, reading and approval of last month's minutes, treasurer's report and town correspondence, Reports from the town officers. Continuing Business, Public comment (upon recognition of chairman), Pay bills, set date for May 2024 town meeting, and Adjournment.

Supervisor Ken Schwanebeck called the meeting to order at 9:10 AM. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Minutes from the March 9,2024 meeting were read. Ken S. made a motion to accept the minutes as read, and it was seconded by Rick S. The motion passed.

The Treasurer's report was given. We have \$70,283.38 in the bank on March 31, 2024.

### **Continuing Business:**

- a. Mail: We received a letter from Kafka Dust-Buster Plus with the 2024 cost of Calcium Chloride and Magnesium Chloride used to control the gravel road dust. Discussion was tabled to May meeting.
- b. The town chairman Andy C. submitted the form for the 6-20ft. Culvert Inventory Project to the County Road Commissioner and to Wisc. Towns Association. We will perform the inventory. The inventory is due by 12/31/2024.
- c. Cemetery Expansion Project work: Lowell Freedlund Clerk needs to correct the name to the Annual Town Meeting in the notice. He recommends that she speak with the Wisc. Towns Association on residents voting for the purchasing of land and on hiring a lawyer if necessary. Also, on whether this purchasing must be noticed in the paper.
- d. ATC high voltage: Ken Schwanebeck attended a meeting in Black River Falls about the proposed power line through the Town of Sherwood. The proposed line would run along the southside Sherwood Rd and Hwy 73 to the east. Lowell Freedlund spoke to a representative at the meeting concerning the cemetery location. They made a note of the cemetery location. Ken stated that the lines right away would be 150 feet off the towns right of way. The towers are 100 ft. tall and 800-1000 feet apart. Residents who wish to voice their opinions should attend meetings that will be held by the Power Commission in the coming year.
- e. 150 year Celebration: nothing.

- f. Road Signs: Road name signs are up and several other signs are in the process of being put up. Weight limit signs are down.
- g. Open Book is April 26,2024 from 2:00pm to 4:00pm.
- h. Board of Review is May 20<sup>th</sup>,2024 from 6:00pm to 8:00pm.
- i. The Annual Meeting is scheduled for April 16<sup>th</sup>,2024 to 6:00pm. At this meeting we will adjourn the meeting to May 11<sup>th</sup>,2024 at 10:00am.
- j. The board approved checks #s 4974 to 4993.
- k. The next Board meeting be Saturday May 18<sup>th</sup>,2024, at 9:00AM at the Sherwood Town Hall. We will discuss upcoming Gravel Bids, Brush Cutting Bids, and Dust Control Bids.

A motion by Rick S. and seconded by Ken S. to adjourn. The motion carried.
